ZONE SWIMMING RESULTS

Last week a number of students from our school competed at the Zone Swimming Carnival with some outstanding results. A special mention must go to Sunjun who achieved Equal 1st Place overall, William who achieved 10th Place overall and the whole Zone team who achieved 9th place overall for PEPS. Well done everyone! You have done us proud!

CLEAN UP AUSTRALIA DAY

Many thanks to those parents who sent in plastic bags and gloves for their children to participate in 'Clean Up Australia Day'. The students did a wonderful job.

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS AND TECHNOLOGY

Many thanks to those families who have already paid a voluntary contribution to the school in 2019. We are investing a significant amount of money from our budget this year into technology in the school, most significantly in the way of iPads and laptops. We are seeking support from our families to do this.

Each iPad will cost the school \$510. This includes a 32GB iPad, a protective case and a license for Parramatta East to manage the iPad through a Mobile Device Management (MDM) which is required for large scale device use.

Our current goal is to raise \$12,000 to purchase new iPads.

100% of this contribution will go towards the purchase of new iPads and the infrastructure to support and manage their use in the classroom. Your valuable contribution will have a direct impact on your child's access to technology in their classroom.

In each newsletter we will update you on our fundraising progress on the thermometer. Each time we reach the \$5,000 mark we will purchase 10 iPads and get them straight into the classrooms. Keep a look out to see how quickly we can reach our target! If you would like to donate more than the \$45 it would be greatly appreciated!

TRAVEL IN SCHOOL TERMS

We have a large number of families who for various reasons take their children out of school during the term to travel. If you are taking your child out of school for a period of more than 10 days the Department of Education requires you to fill in an Extended Leave form and make an appointment to speak to Mrs Smith, Mrs Curtis or myself before purchasing flights.

ABSENTEE NOTES

It is imperative that if your child is off sick that the school receives a note either via the Skoolbag app or handwritten upon their return. The Department of Education has strict guidelines around absences and the explanations of such. If your child does not return to school with a note explaining their absence then their classroom teacher will be sending an absence note home for parents/carers to fill in and return.

SOAP IN TOILETS

A number of parents have raised with me the issue of soap in the toilets. Could I ask you to please talk to your children about the fact that they only need 1-2 pumps of the liquid soap to wash their hands. We are very fortunate to have the most wonderful cleaner and she fills the soap dispensers in the toilets every single day. We do however have children who think that it is great fun to continually press the dispenser button until all of the liquid soap is dispensed, leaving it empty. If children are taught to use the soap dispensers correctly then this issue should be resolved.

RUBBISH IN TOILETS

Another issue that we are encountering is that we have students who are depositing all sorts of things into our toilets – sandwiches, drink bottles, lunchboxes, pencils, pencil cases to name but a few. Could we ask that you speak to your children about this as again it is causing a great deal of distress to our wonderful cleaner who has to physically remove these items from the toilet bowls.

INCREASED POLICE AND COUNCIL PRESENCE

You may have noticed that there has been an increased Police and Council presence both before and after school. We have requested this due to the increased number of parents who are blatantly disobeying the road rules around the school and putting the safety of our students at risk. Last week alone we had 4 students who had near misses being hit by cars. Can I please implore you to acknowledge the road rules for the safety of all.

COFFEE, CAKE AND CHAT

Thank you to all parents who came to our Coffee, Cake and Chat. It was wonderful to see so many of you there and to be able to offer you the opportunity to sit and hear what you had to say about our school. Please rest assured that behind the scenes we are working on the suggestions that you had for us.

GARDENS

You may have noticed that there has been quite a bit of clearing of gardens in the front part of the school. Thanks must go to Mr Geoff, Mr Bill, Miss Rena, Mr Curtis and Mr Miller who have worked tirelessly with this. We have now welcomed Mr Jordan to our team to assist. As previously mentioned we will soon be organising a working bee to plant out the gardens at the front of the school and our Indigenous garden near the play equipment. We would love to see as many volunteers as possible to assist with this. Watch this space for a date. If any members of our community have connections with companies that may be willing to donate treated pine sleepers for garden edging, plants, fertiliser or mulch – please let us know. It would be greatly appreciated! Our hope is to work our way through the whole school providing some much needed love to our gardens and making our school a beautiful place that we can all be proud and respectful of, with ownership extending to our community members.

P & C MEETING

Our next P & C Meeting will be held on Monday, 18th March, 2019 @ 7pm in our Staffroom. It would be wonderful to see as many parents as possible there!

MOBILE PHONES

I would like to advise that from the beginning of the 2019 school year student mobile phones will no longer be able to be dropped off and picked up from the office during the school day. Should you wish to send your child to school with a mobile phone it will need to be securely stored in their school bag from the time students enter the school grounds until the time they leave the school grounds. The school will not be liable for any phones that are damaged or go missing. I thank you in advance for your understanding in this matter.

SCHOOL FENCING

Parramatta East has security fencing around the perimeter of the school. This is to ensure that our students are safe on a daily basis. I have asked Miss Rena, Mr Geoff and our student helpers to lock all gates, except the two at the front of the school at 9.15am. These will then reopen at 3.00pm in the afternoon to allow pickup of your children, being locked again at 3.45pm.

REPORTING TO OFFICE

It has come to my attention that there are still a number of parents who enter the school grounds during our school day and do not report to the office. This poses a huge Work, Health and Safety risk for us as a school. Should there be an emergency, we need to know who is on site so that we can make sure that everyone, including parents are safe. To this end, could I ask that if you are coming into the school grounds during the school day that you sign in at the School Office to obtain a visitor's pass and then sign back out at the office as you leave. This is standard practice in any school and is a requirement of the Department of Education.

LATE ARRIVALS

We still have a large amount of late arrivals to school each day. If your child is late to school, it is a requirement of the school that you accompany your child to the office to get a late slip. Could I kindly ask that you do not drop them at the gate and then leave.

SUPERVISION OF STUDENTS BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL

The school day begins promptly at 9.15am and finishes promptly at 3.15pm. Playground supervision does not begin until 8.45am. Could I kindly ask that you do not drop your children off at school before this time. Again, it is a Work, Health and Safety issue. Similarly, we have a number of students who either sit in our office area, or of greater concern, stand outside the school waiting for parents to pick them up. We often have students still waiting for pick up as late as 4.00pm. We are fortunate enough to have an OOSH onsite. If your work commitments do not allow for prompt drop off and pickup, could I suggest that you investigate this option.

UNIFORM UPDATE

It is wonderful to see so many of our students in full school uniform, either new or old. There are a couple of things that I would like to clarify:

- There is a 3 year transition period from the current uniform to the new uniform.
- Attached to the last newsletter was a visual reminder of what PEPS school uniform is.
- Attached to the last school newsletter was a current price list.

PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT

Just a reminder that the playground equipment is out of bounds before school, it would be appreciated if parents could also keep younger siblings off the equipment in the mornings.

SANDPIT

Our sandpit continues to be a huge success offering our students an extra activity to do in the playground. We are investigating getting a cover for the sandpit in the near future. It would be appreciated if outside of school hours children do not play in the sandpit as this becomes a duty of care issue. Not to mention the fact that the sand is very quickly depleting as the children scoop it up and drop it on the ground outside of the pit.

Could you be an ethics teacher at Parramatta East Public School?



We are excited to welcome four new ethics teachers in 2019. Two ethics classes have started and we are expecting four more classes to begin by Term 2. However, as we continue to have a waiting list, it would be wonderful to hear from anyone who would like to volunteer. Ethics classes run on Thursdays from 9:15-9:45am for Year 3-6 and 9:45-10:15am for K-2. More teachers will also allow us to open up more classes for those years in which our class sizes are at their maximum (i.e. 22 students).

Ethics teachers receive full training by Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the ethics program. Training consists of a two day workshop and short online modules. Lesson materials are provided. Suitable volunteers have an interest in children's education and development of critical thinking skills. Ongoing training and support is available.

In ethics class, children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure.

Children discuss topic such as:

- Imagining how others feel
- How do we treat living things?
- What is laziness?
- How do we disagree in a respectful way?
